**BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE**

Murray Green (1916-2002) was deputy chief of research and analysis for the secretary of the Air Force, and a leading expert and biographer in the life and military career of General Henry H. "Hap" Arnold.

Born in the Bronx, New York, he earned his bachelor's and master's degrees from City College of New York and a doctorate from American University in Washington D.C. During World War II he was a Navy cryptographer, and he participated in the Leyte, Mindoro, and Luzon operations in the Philippines as well as the Borneo and Okinawa campaigns in the east Asia. He attained the rank of lieutenant and joined the Air Force Reserves where he rose to the rank of colonel. Before his retirement in 1974, he was deputy chief of research and analysis for the secretary of the Air Force at the Pentagon. In the mid-1960s he studied public reaction to defense-related issues, including the Vietnam War. From 1968 to 1989 his primary activities involved researching the career of five-star general and pioneer airman Henry Harley "Hap" Arnold. A complete manuscript was produced from this research and is included in this collection, though it was never published. Dr. Green donated his vast collection of Hap Arnold related research materials to the Air Force Academy, through the Falcon Foundation, in 1989.

Henry Harley "Hap" Arnold (1886-1950), about whom this collection was produced, was commander of the US Army Air Forces in World War II and the only officer to hold a five-star grade in two different U.S. military services; the Army and the Air Force. Instructed to fly by the Wright Brothers, Arnold was one of the first military pilots and the second rated pilot in the history of the Air Force. Arnold played a key role in the political struggles between the US Army and US Navy prior to World War II, and was a powerful advocate for creation of an independent Air Force. During his long career Arnold wrote several books, including a post-World War II autobiography entitled *Global Mission*, a first-hand account of Air Force activities during the war. Hap Arnold died at his ranch home near Sonoma, California on January 15, 1950. Several biographical manuscripts and articles relating to Arnold, both published and unpublished, are included in this collection.

Other materials related to General Arnold can be found in the Henry H. Arnold collection, SMS 322, also located in the Clark Special Collections branch of the Academy's McDermott Library.

## SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

This collection consists of a significant body of documentation that was gathered by Dr. Murray Green in conjunction with his research on the life and military career of General Henry H. Arnold. The collection consists of 111 boxes of manuscript material arranged in eleven series, outlined below.

A nearly complete set of microfilm copies of the of the materials in this collection, along with duplicate copies of the audio files found herein, is also available as an addendum to this collection (Addendum 5).

### **SERIES ONE: INDEX/BIBLIOGRAPHIC NOTE CARDS**

Consists of around 50,000 5" x 8" index cards, divided among 56 boxes. They are arranged by various subject areas using a decimal system implemented by Dr. Green during his research. Though these cards do not contain the original, primary source materials they describe, they do include abstracts, transcripts, photocopies, and citations of documents that Dr. Green reviewed during his research. Sources of the information contained in each card are noted in the top-right corner, and include repositories such as the National Archives, Library of Congress, Arnold's home in California, the US Military Academy at West Point, and the papers of Dwight David Eisenhower among others. Many of these cards also refer to the oral history transcripts within this collection, located in Series Two.

### **SERIES TWO: ORAL HISTORY TRANSCRIPTS**

Consists of 240 oral history transcripts of tape-recorded interviews conducted by Dr. Green with General Arnold's contemporaries and members of the Arnold family. Compiled between 1967 and 1977, the interviews provide graphic insights into General Arnold's personal and official activities. The transcripts have been arranged alphabetically by name of interviewee and are noted within the Arrangement and Description section of this manuscript record. Abstracts of these interviews can also be found in Clark Special Collection's *Oral History Index*, located on the library's website. Oral history transcripts and recordings are open and available in line with guidance from the Arnold estate (Robert Arnold, Feb 2024). See Clark Special Collections staff for more information.

### **SERIES THREE: ORAL HISTORY TAPE RECORDINGS**

Consists of 207 tape recordings of oral history interviews conducted by Dr. Green. Several of the tape recordings contain more than one interview. The tapes (reel to reel) have been transcribed and the transcripts are listed within Series Two of this manuscript record. The series also contains 17 research tapes compiled by Dr. Green during the course of his research. The tapes contain dictated notes recorded by Dr. Green from an official series of records including General Arnold's 201 file and the papers of Dwight D. Eisenhower and are noted within Series Three of this manuscript record (the number of each transcribed recording has been appended to the corresponding transcript within Series Two). The original recordings are kept in the Clark Special Collections audiovisual storage room and are not available for research use, though

digital copies may be available upon request. Oral history transcripts and recordings are open and available in line with guidance from the Arnold estate (Robert Arnold, Feb 2024). See Clark Special Collections staff for more information.

#### **SERIES FOUR: DIARIES**

Consists of eight trip diaries maintained by General Arnold during World War II, along with photocopies of each diary. The diaries detail Arnold's trips to Europe, China, the Middle East, and the Pacific during the War. Trips documented include England 1941, Arcadia 1942, England 1942, the Casablanca Conference 1943, China 1943, England 1943, England 1944, the Octagon Conference 1944, and the Pacific Theater 1945. Entries provide extraordinary insights into the evolution of Allied air doctrine, combined Allied operations during the war, Arnold's candid observations of American and British officers, and the characteristics of major political figures including Franklin D. Roosevelt, Winston Churchill, and Chiang Kai-shek.

#### **SERIES FIVE: OFFICE APPOINTMENT CALENDARS/VISITOR LOGBOOKS**

Consists of four appointment calendars maintained in General Arnold's offices between 1942 and 1945, and 13 visitor logbooks dated from 1939 to 1946. In addition to listing visitors received by Arnold, a limited number of the entries reference topics of discussion and various meeting agenda items.

#### **SERIES SIX: MANUSCRIPTS**

Consists of unpublished manuscripts either written by Dr. Green in conjunction with his research or collected from others due to their connection to the history of American air power. The series contains Dr. Green's manuscripts *Hap Arnold: A Man in a Hurry* and *Hap Arnold and the Birth of the United States Air Force*, Maj. Gen. Hugh Knerr's *The Vital Era*, and the original manuscript of General Arnold's *Global Mission*. The series also includes bibliographic note cards and the manuscript of Dr. Green's master thesis and subsequent book, *Stuart Symington and the B-36*.

#### **SERIES SEVEN: TOPICAL FILES**

Consists of series of correspondence, memoranda, and reports arranged by subject matter. Included is data gathered by Dr. Green in support of the "Arnold Projects," which include a proposed movie to be based on the life of General Arnold, Dr. Green's biography, and the Arnold oral history project. Additional files contain extensive research material on the life and career of George W. Goddard, memoranda, and reports on the "Alaskan Flight of 1934," reports of inspection of Brig Gen Harold A. McGinnis, Office of the Inspector General, USSAF, 1942-1943, and the official report of the Doolittle raid on Japan in April 1942.

#### **SERIES EIGHT: CORRESPONDENCE**

Consists of six series of photocopied or transcribed letters and memoranda gathered by Dr. Green during the course of his research, which are outlined in the Arrangement and Description section of this manuscript record. Also included are letters pertaining to the military career of Maj. General Walter Weaver, and typed transcripts and photocopies of a file of General Arnold's

official correspondence between 1942 and 1945, which was gathered by Dr. Green in support of his Arnold biography and a proposed "Dear Generals" book. The letters and memoranda provide an insight into General Arnold's activities and his interaction with American and Allied military figures during World War II.

### **SERIES NINE: PHOTOGRAPHS**

Consists of photographs depicting General Arnold's personal and official activities between 1891 and 1950. The bulk of the photographs are dated and captioned and depict General Arnold's wartime contemporaries and activities, 1941-1945. Also included are several photographs that depict American military aviation pioneers, General Arnold's pioneer flights, and flights of the Army Air Corps during the 1930s, including the airmail flights and the "Alaskan Flight" of 1934. Also included are a series of photographs of the Arnold family, 1891-1950, and photographs of General Arnold's funeral in January 1950.

### **SERIES TEN: PRINTED MATTER**

Consists of a series of government documents containing General Arnold's congressional testimony on the status of American air power 1919, 1945, 1946, articles written by Dr. Green that pertain to General Arnold's career and the history of the Air Force, periodical literature relating to the evolution of American air power, and a collection of miscellaneous news clippings pertaining to General Arnold's career.

### **SERIES ELEVEN: MISCELLANEOUS**

Consists of a fragmented series of genealogical information on the Arnold family, General Arnold's Christmas card list for 1945, General Arnold's high school graduation program from 1903, and a written agreement between General Arnold and his children detailing the children's allowance, and rules of conduct within the Arnold household.

Addendum Five consists of duplicated material contained within the primary MS 33 collection and is held within the Clark Special Collections audiovisual storage room. It includes twenty-five boxes divided into two series, outlined below.
