SCOPE AND CONTENT

This collection was assembled largely from the files of the Historical Office of the Secretary of Defense between 1974 and 1998, as part of the research effort for the department's official history *Honor Bound: The History of American Prisoners of War in Southeast Asia, 1961-1973*. As such, it focuses primarily American prisoners of war (POWs) who were held captive in Southeast Asia over the course of the Vietnam War, and various ancillary topics that surround their imprisonment. It also includes materials produced in the research process for the book, *Honor Bound*. Major topics include the historical and geographical background leading to the Vietnam Conflict; events of the conflict; prisoner of war experiences in Laos, Cambodia, China, and Vietnam; North Vietnamese prison camps; prison camp officials, interrogators, and guards; treatment of POWs including torture, psychological warfare, and the exploitation of prisoners for propaganda; the Armed Forces Code of Conduct; soldier misconduct; prisoner of war organization and resistance; accounting for personnel missing in action or known to be captured; antiwar activism; efforts on behalf of the missing and imprisoned; negotiations for prisoner release; struggles faced by families of the missing and imprisoned; preparation for returning prisoners of war; readjustment of returned prisoners of war and their families; and analyses of the prisoner of war experience. Most of the items in this collection are from the period following World War II, and more specifically from 1961 to 1973, the most heated years of the Vietnam Conflict. The material in this collection was gathered and donated by Dr. Frederick Kiley and the Office of the Secretary of Defense.

This collection consists of 176 boxes containing documents, photographs, maps, artifacts, and audiovisual materials. These files were arranged topically by the donor of the collection and divided into 52 series by Special Collections staff, which are outlined below.

SERIES ONE: SOUTHEAST ASIA BACKGROUND

Contains memoranda, handbooks, guidebooks, reports, studies, pamphlets, articles, newspaper clippings, and maps pertaining to general information about South Vietnam, North Vietnam, Taiwan, China, Laos, Cambodia, and Thailand. This general information describes the

geography, history, culture, customs, religions, economy, languages, politics, and peoples of the Southeast Asia region.

SERIES TWO: HISTORICAL CHRONOLOGIES

Contains memoranda, reports, and papers pertaining to Southeast Asia, United States involvement in Southeast Asia, and Prisoners of War in Southeast Asia. These materials help outline the chronology of events in Southeast Asia ending in the 1960s.

SERIES THREE: VIETNAM CONFLICT CHRONOLOGIES, 1961-1973

Contains reports and papers pertaining to United States involvement in Southeast Asia and Prisoners of War in Southeast Asia. This material includes chronologies which begin after 1960.

SERIES FOUR: HONOR BOUND WORKING CHRONOLOGIES, 1961-1973

Contains typed and handwritten working papers pertaining to world events, the Southeast Asia conflict, United States involvement in Southeast Asia, prisoners of war in Southeast Asia, propaganda releases, prisoner of war homecoming, and Department of Defense efforts on behalf of prisoners of war.

SERIES FIVE: HISTORICAL PRISONER OF WAR TREATMENT, 3000 B.C. - WORLD WAR II

Contains reports, studies, and journal articles pertaining to worldwide treatment of prisoners of war throughout history, including United States and Allied treatment of prisoners during World War II.

SERIES SIX: MODERN PRISONER OF WAR TREATMENT, WORLD WAR II - PRESENT

Contains memoranda, reports, studies, articles, and newspaper clippings pertaining to the Geneva Convention of 1947 and later revisions, the Korean War, the French Indochina War, the Vietnam conflict, regional conflicts, Communist treatment of prisoners of war, and the International Committee of the Red Cross including material on adherence or noncompliance with Geneva Convention articles and protocols.

SERIES SEVEN: SURVIVAL, EVASION, RESISTANCE, ESCAPE (SERE) TRAINING AND CODE OF CONDUCT PRIOR TO 1973

Contains reports, studies, pamphlets, articles, and newspaper clippings pertaining to the United States Armed Forces Code of Conduct, reviews of the Code, and SERE training, including SERE comments by returned prisoners of war in 1955.

SERIES EIGHT: ACCOUNTS OF UNITED STATES/WORLD EVENTS, 1961-1973

Contains reports, articles, and newspaper clippings pertaining to worldwide events occurring

during the Vietnam conflict, including reactions by the United States Congress, White House, Departments of Defense and State, the media, and foreign nations.

SERIES NINE: ACCOUNTS OF VIETNAM/SOUTHEAST ASIA EVENTS, 1961-1973

Contains reports, studies, articles, and newspaper clippings pertaining to events that occurred in Southeast Asia during the Vietnam Conflict including material on North Vietnam, South Vietnam, Cambodia, Laos, the U.S.S. Pueblo, the Viet Cong, the Pathet Lao, and the communist perspective in Southeast Asia.

SERIES TEN: CONGRESSIONAL PRISONER OF WAR/MISSING IN ACTION POLICY AND ACTIONS, 1961-1973

Contains correspondence, reports, and legislation pertaining to the treatment of allied and enemy prisoners of war during the Vietnam Conflict, efforts to repatriate United States prisoners of war, and benefits for repatriated prisoners of war and their families.

SERIES ELEVEN: DEFENSE DEPARTMENT, STATE DEPARTMENT, AND WHITE HOUSE PRISONER OF WAR/MISSING IN ACTION POLICY AND ACTIONS, 1961-1973

Contains memoranda, handbooks, reports, and legislation pertaining to the treatment of allied and enemy prisoners of war during the Vietnam Conflict, efforts to repatriate United States prisoners of war, and benefits for repatriated prisoners of war and their families.

SERIES TWELVE: CASUALTY REPORTS, 1961-1973

Contains an award citation, correspondence, reports, papers, press releases, articles, newspaper clippings and graphs pertaining to the Department of Defense Casualty Reporting System, casualty lists, Killed in Action, Missing in Action, Prisoners of War, and equipment lost.

SERIES THIRTEEN: PRISONER OF WAR/MISSING IN ACTION ACCOUNTING, 1961-1973

Contains correspondence, memoranda, notes, reports, statements, press releases, bulletins, articles, and newspaper clippings pertaining to casualty reporting, capture and movement of prisoners of war, and killed in action/missing in action/prisoner of war status changes, including Project Brightlight and next-of-kin notification.

SERIES FOURTEEN: PRISONER OF WAR RESCUES & ESCAPES, 1961-1973

Contains correspondence, memoranda, notes, book excerpts, reports, studies, press releases, magazine/journal articles, and newspaper clippings pertaining to rescue operations and escapes including the Armand J. Myers study Vietnam Prisoner of War Camp Histories and Studies: Escapes, Operation Rescue, and escape descriptions by George Day and Dieter Dengler.

SERIES FIFTEEN: PRISONER OF WAR CAMP HISTORIES, 1961-1973

Contains notes, reports, studies, papers, sketches, diagrams and maps pertaining to descriptions of prisoner of war camp facilities, living conditions, and event histories including the Armand J. Myers study, Vietnam Prisoner of War Camp Histories and Studies Volumes I and II, the Navy Center for Prisoner of War Studies (CPOWS) "Camp Histories," and "MIA Information Books Section II: POW Camps."

SERIES SIXTEEN: PRISONER OF WAR CAMP ENEMY PERSONNEL, 1961-1973

Contains notes, book excerpts, reports, and papers pertaining to enemy camp personnel and communist Vietnam leadership including guards, interrogators, administrators, nicknames, and descriptions.

SERIES SEVENTEEN: PRISONER OF WAR TREATMENT, 1961-1973

Contains notes, book excerpts, reports, studies, press releases, magazine and journal articles, and newspaper clippings pertaining to prisoner of war daily life, interrogation, indoctrination, isolation, torture and coercion including Ray Vohden's "Stress Situations Listed in Descending Order of Amount of Stress Produced."

SERIES EIGHTEEN: PRISONER OF WAR RESISTANCE, 1961-1973

Contains notes, book excerpts, reports, studies, papers, and articles pertaining to organization, chain of command, communication, coping techniques, and resistance strategies and tactics including Bagley's "Leadership From Positions of Absenteeism, Solitary Confinement, and Isolation" and Luke's "Analysis of Leadership and Organization Attempts of United States Prisoners of War in Southeast Asia."

SERIES NINETEEN: PROPAGANDA/EXPLOITATION OF PRISONERS OF WAR, 1961-1973

Contains correspondence, notes, book excerpts, reports, studies, briefings, press releases, articles, newspaper clippings and photos pertaining to communist propaganda, United States analysis studies and prisoner of war appearances and statements including the Air Force Exploitation Analysis Project.

SERIES TWENTY: PROPAGANDA/EXPLOITATION OF PRISONER OF WAR EARLY RELEASES, 1961-1973

Contains letters of appreciation, correspondence, memoranda, notes, reports, studies, papers, press releases, magazine and journal articles, and newspaper clippings pertaining to prisoner of war releases and repatriation prior to the 1973 Paris Peace Accords including biographical sketches, releasee treatment, press conferences and legal questions.

SERIES TWENTY ONE: PROPAGANDA/EXPLOITATION OF NON-PRISONERS OF WAR, 1961-1973

Contains notes, book excerpts, reports, pamphlets, articles, and newspaper clippings pertaining to international communist activists, anti-war activists, and illegal trips to North Vietnam by United States citizens including Australian Wilfred Burchett, Noam Chomsky, Ramsey Clark, Jane Fonda and the Committee of Liaison for Families of Prisoners of War and Missing in Action (COLIAFAM).

SERIES TWENTY TWO: PRISONER OF WAR ANECDOTAL ACCOUNTS, 1961-1973

Contains notes, chapter drafts, book excerpts, reports, papers, speeches, magazine and journal articles, and newspaper clippings pertaining to personal descriptions the Southeast Asia prisoner of war experience by returned prisoners of war.

SERIES TWENTY THREE: FOREIGN NATIONAL & CIVILIAN PRISONERS OF WAR, 1961-1973

Contains notes, a book review, reports, magazine and journal articles, and newspaper clippings pertaining to foreign nationals and United States civilians held by communists including Bernhard Diehl, Monika Schwinn, and Michael Benge.

SERIES TWENTY FOUR: PRISONERS HELD OUTSIDE VIETNAM, 1961-1973

Contains notes, a book review, reports, articles, and newspaper clippings pertaining to United States military personnel and civilians captured during the Vietnam Conflict and imprisoned in Korea, China, Cambodia and Laos including the crew of the U.S.S. Pueblo, Mary Ann Harbert, and Anthony Gray.

SERIES TWENTY FIVE: ENEMY PRISONERS OF WAR, 1961-1973

Contains memoranda, book excerpts, reports, studies, manuals, press releases, articles, newspaper clippings and photos pertaining to South Vietnamese prisoner of war camps for captured enemies, South Vietnamese civilian prison camps, South Vietnamese treatment of captured enemies, and United States treatment of captured enemies. It also includes documentation of congressional investigations and the Army Corps of Engineers study of U.S. Preparedness for Future Enemy POW/Detainee Operations.

SERIES TWENTY SIX: PEACE NEGOTIATIONS AND PARIS PEACE ACCORDS, 1967-1973

Contains correspondence, memoranda, notes, book excerpts, reports, studies, papers, briefings, press releases, articles, and newspaper clippings pertaining to early negotiations with the North Vietnamese, Paris Peace Talks, and the 1973 Paris Peace Accords, including President Johnson era negotiations, President Nixon era negotiations, and the articles of the Paris Peace Accords.

SERIES TWENTY SEVEN: EGRESS RECAP AND HOMECOMING PLANNING, 1971-1973

Contains memoranda, notes, reports, studies, papers, pamphlets, briefings, press releases, articles, and newspaper clippings pertaining to Egress Recap planning and homecoming planning including medical and psychological health care, follow-up career rehabilitation, family reunification, societal readjustment, and initial returnee processing and debriefing.

SERIES TWENTY EIGHT: PRISONER OF WAR/MISSING IN ACTION HOMECOMING EVENTS, 1973

Contains letters of appreciation, correspondence, memoranda, reports, briefings, press releases, articles, and newspaper clippings pertaining to prisoner of war return to United States custody, initial processing, reunification with families, press interviews, and local news reports.

SERIES TWENTY NINE: PRISONER OF WAR/MISSING IN ACTION HOMECOMING ACCOUNTS

Contains notes, reports, statements, press releases, and newspaper clippings pertaining to casualty reporting, unaccounted for personnel, and killed in action/missing in action/prisoner of war status changes, primarily from the year 1973.

SERIES THIRTY: HOMECOMING DEBRIEFS AND AFTER ACTION REPORTS

Contains reports and manuals pertaining to homecoming activities including Military Airlift Command Homecoming After Action Reports, the 7602nd Homecoming critique, and the Special History of Project Homecoming.

SERIES THIRTY ONE: POST-HOMECOMING PRISONER OF WAR/MISSING IN ACTION EVENTS

Contains letters of appreciation, memoranda, press releases, articles, newspaper clippings and maps pertaining to returnee health care, readjustment to United States society, interviews and public statements, and newsworthy events.

SERIES THIRTY TWO: POST-HOMECOMING PRISONER OF WAR/MISSING IN ACTION ACCOUNTS, 1973-1999

Contains correspondence, memoranda, notes, reports, papers, pamphlets, statements, press releases, newsletters, magazine and journal articles, newspaper clippings pertaining to unaccounted for personnel, killed in action/missing in action/prisoner of war status changes and efforts to obtain accounting by the North Vietnamese including congressional hearings, the MIA Information Books, and the POW-MIA Fact Book.

SERIES THIRTY THREE: ACCOUNTS OF WORLD EVENTS, 1973-1999

Contains correspondence, memoranda, handbooks, guidebooks, reports, studies, pamphlets, articles, newspaper clippings and maps pertaining to worldwide events occurring after the Vietnam conflict, including reactions by the United States Congress, White House, Departments of Defense and State, the media, and foreign nations.

SERIES THIRTY FOUR: ACCOUNTS OF VIETNAM/SOUTHEAST ASIA EVENTS, 1973-1999

Contains notes, reports, papers, bulletins, articles, and newspaper clippings pertaining to events occurring in Southeast Asia after the Vietnam Conflict including material on North Vietnam, South Vietnam, Cambodia, and Laos, the collapse of South Vietnam, and normalization of relations with communist Vietnam.

SERIES THIRTY FIVE: PRIVATE SECTOR EFFORTS ON BEHALF OF PRISONERS OF WAR

Contains awards, correspondence, memoranda, notes, reports, papers, statements, newsletters, articles, and newspaper clippings pertaining to efforts by nongovernmental organizations and individual citizens during on behalf of POW/MIA personnel. Includes efforts by the National League of Families (NLF or NLOF), the Committee of Liaison (COLIAFAM), Voices in Vital America (VIVA), and MIA search fraud.

SERIES THIRTY SIX: FAMILY ISSUES, 1961-1999

Contains notes, reports, studies, pamphlets, press releases, articles, and newspaper clippings pertaining to problems faced by, and assistance available to, families of POW/MIA personnel and returnees. This series includes the congressional report "Problems of Prisoners of War and Their Families" and additional published material.

SERIES THIRTY SEVEN: PRISONER OF WAR/MISSING IN ACTION BENEFITS

Contains awards, correspondence, memoranda, reports, pamphlets, legislation, articles, and newspaper clippings pertaining to benefits proposed or enacted to assist POW/MIA families and returned prisoners of war.

SERIES THIRTY EIGHT: PRISONER OF WAR/MISSING IN ACTION LEGAL ISSUES

Contains memoranda, reports, papers, articles, and newspaper clippings pertaining to legal action considered or initiated by or against ex-prisoners of war including Edison Miller and Robert Garwood.

SERIES THIRTY NINE: VIETNAM CONFLICT REVIEW

Contains memoranda, reports, studies, papers, articles, newspaper clippings, and maps pertaining to a retrospective discussion of any aspect of the Vietnam Conflict including policy, strategy, combat, casualties, anti-war activism, desertion, defection, draft dodgers, amnesty, and post-war visits to Vietnam.

SERIES FORTY: PRISONER OF WAR EXPERIENCE ANALYSIS

Contains memoranda, notes, reports, studies, papers, articles, and newspaper clippings pertaining to analyses of the prisoner of war experience in Southeast Asia including returned prisoner of war oral histories and the 7602nd Air Intelligence Group's Southeast Asia Prisoner of War Experience Analysis Program (POWEAP).

SERIES FORTY ONE: PRISONER OF WAR LONG TERM CAPTIVITY EFFECTS

Contains correspondence, memoranda, reports, studies, papers, articles, and newspaper clippings pertaining to the long term physical and psychological health of returned prisoners of war including Nefzger's "Follow-Up Studies of World War II and Korean War Prisoners," the Naval Health Research Center's "Injuries and Illnesses of Vietnam POWs," and Hunter's "The Vietnam POW Veteran: Immediate and Long Term Effects of Captivity."

SERIES FORTY TWO: SURVIVAL EVASION RESISTANCE ESCAPE (SERE) AND CODE OF CONDUCT REVIEW, 1973-1999

Contains memoranda, handbooks, notes, reports, studies, pamphlets, articles, newspaper clippings pertaining to SERE training and Code of Conduct evaluation after the Vietnam Conflict including Myers' "POW Doctrine for Survival with Honor, The U.S. Fighting Man's Code," Holt's "POW: Prisoners of War," and 1974 SERE Conference literature and notes.

SERIES FORTY THREE: LESSONS LEARNED BRIEFINGS

Contains notes, reports, speeches and briefings pertaining to Lessons Learned briefings presented to the Joint Chiefs of Staff after the Vietnam Conflict.

SERIES FORTY FOUR: HONOR BOUND WORKING PAPERS

Contains correspondence, memoranda, galley proofs, chapter drafts, notes, reports, papers, articles, newspaper clippings, sketches, graphs and maps pertaining to the background of the Vietnam Conflict and the prisoner of war experience during the Vietnam Conflict.

SERIES FORTY FIVE: THE LONG ROAD HOME CHAPTER DRAFTS

Contains correspondence, memoranda, chapter drafts, and notes pertaining to governmental prisoner of war/missing in action policy and planning.

SERIES FORTY SIX: HONOR BOUND SOURCES, CITATIONS AND BOOK REVIEWS

Contains correspondence, memoranda, notes, bibliographies, abstracts, and book reviews pertaining to research materials used in the production of *Honor Bound*.

SERIES FORTY SEVEN: VIETNAM CONFLICT LITERATURE AND ART

Contains books, book excerpts, and articles pertaining to allied and communist perspectives on the Vietnam Conflict.

SERIES FORTY EIGHT: VIETNAM CONFLICT FILMS AND VIDEOS

Contains correspondence, scripts, articles, videotapes, and films pertaining to the Vietnam Conflict, prisoners of war, and POW/MIA families including the East German propaganda film "Pilots in Pajamas."

SERIES FORTY NINE: VIETNAM CONFLICT PHOTOGRAPHS

Contains notes and photos pertaining to Korean prisoners of war, the Vietnam conflict, and prisoners of war in Southeast Asia during and after the Vietnam Conflict.

SERIES FIFTY: VIETNAM CONFLICT AUDIO

Contains reel-to-reel tapes, cassette tapes, audiotapes, and LPs pertaining to prisoner of war and missing in action events during and after the Vietnam Conflict.

SERIES FIFTY ONE: VIETNAM CONFLICT ARTIFACTS

Contains miscellaneous artifacts including a brick from the Hanoi Hilton prison camp and numerous political buttons.

SERIES FIFTY TWO: VIETNAM CONFLICT MAPS

Contains notes, reports, and maps pertaining to general information about Southeast Asia as well as information about prisoner of war shootdown, evasion, capture, movement, escape, imprisonment, and fate.
