BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

John Morley Bennett (1918-1989) served in the 341st Bomber Squadron, 97th Bomber Group, Heavy, as a Captain and Pilot on the B-17 #41-24344 during World War II.

Bennett survived when his airplane crashed in Saint-Vougay, France. On October 21, 1942, his crew took off from Station 110 airfield in Polebrook, England, for a bombing attack in Lorient, France. Upon arrival over the target, their plane was shot down by an FW 190 piloted by Armind Landman and exploded. Among the ten crew members, only two survived. They were thrown out of the plane by the explosion. Cpt. Bennett was captured and sent to Stalag Luft III prison camp in Sagan, Germany (Żagań, Poland). Bennett was held at Stalag Luft III until January 1944 when he and his fellow prisoners were marched to Stalag VII-A in Moosburg, which is where he remained until the camp was liberated several month later.

Part of this collection was donated to the Air Force Academy by Colonel Bennett before his death in 1989, and the rest was donated by his wife, Lorraine, in 2013. SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

This collection consists of four series divided into two boxes, outlined in the *Arrangement and Description* section of the finding aid. Most of this collection pertains to John M. Bennett and his experience as a prisoner of war at Stalag Luft III and Stalag VII-A, where he was detained from 1942 to 1945.

Additionally, the memoirs of Freidrich-Wilhelm von Lindeiner-Wildau (Col. von Lindeiner), in Series Two, provide a complete account of the administration of Stalag Luft III from the perspective of the German officer in charge of the facility.
