BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

1st Lt. Emmet E. Cook was a bombardier in the 301st Bombardment Group, 352nd Squadron, who was shot down over Palermo, Sicily. After crash landing he was captured by local Italian soldiers, turned over to the Luftwaffe, and taken to the Stalag Luft III prison camp in Sagan, Germany (now Żagań, Poland). While imprisoned he was involved in an escape plot when he created a map of the camp that was used by other prisoners to dig escape tunnels. Cook and his conspirators were caught, however, and transferred to another part of the prison camp before an attempt could be made. Just two months later, the "Great Escape" took place from the original compound. Cook was freed in April 1945 after two years, one month, and seven days as a POW. Cook returned to his home in Fort Worth, Texas and took a job with Globe Aircraft as a production test pilot for Globe Swifts.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

This collection consists of three folders divided into three series. Of note are two prisoner of war journals maintained by Emmet Cook during his confinement in Stalag Luft III. The first is a "war-time Log" provided by the YMCA that consists of artwork by Cook and others, poems, prisoner lists, and photographs of the camp and his fellow prisoners. The second notebook contains a short compilation of the major events of World War II, a list of letters sent and received by Cook, and a list of other prisoners in his compound. Finally, there is a short biography of Cook's experiences and some additional unidentified photographs.
