BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Major General Vincent Crabb (1902-1981) joined the Army Air Corps as an Aviation Cadet on 21 February 1929. Graduating and receiving his wings in 1930, he became a Second Lieutenant in the Air Reserves. As a company grade officer, Crabb held various positions in an expanding Air Corps. These included Commanding Officer (CO) of the 19th Composite Wing, Albrook Field, Florida, in 1933 and CO of the 14th Reconnaissance Squadron, Miami, Florida. He participated in the 1935 Mitchell Trophy Races at Selfridge Field, Michigan.

At the start of World War II his experience with reconnaissance led him to bomber aircraft. His principal overseas assignment was with the 5th Bomber Command as Chief of Staff, 1942-1943, in the Southwest Pacific, and later as CO, Headquarters Advance Echelon, 5th Air Force. After the war, he remained in the Pacific Theater. From 20 June 1949 -17 January 1952, he acted as the Deputy Chief of Staff for Operations, Far East Air Forces (FEAF), in Tokyo, Japan. From this position he was able to follow much of the day-to-day military activity of the Korean War. After the conflict, Major General Crabb accepted assignment as Chief of Staff, Air Defense Command, Colorado Springs, Colorado, where he retired in July 1961.

Major General Crabb donated this collection to the Air Force Academy in 1971.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

This collection relates to Major General Crabb's military career, from 1929-1961. The most significant part of the material deals with Crabb's official role as Deputy Chief of Staff for Operations of FEAF during the Korean War. The balance, mostly of personal nature, contains materials which relate to the Army Air Corps of the 1930s and WWII in the Southwest Pacific.

This collection consists of four boxes of manuscript material arranged in six series, outlined in the Arrangement and Description section below. Additionally, the Oral History Collection of Special Collections contains an Oral History Interview prepared by the Department of History, USAF Academy. The tape and corrected transcript cover Major General Crabb's WWII experiences with particular emphasis on aircraft and personalities, e.g., MacArthur, Kenny.
