BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

The National Advisory Committee for Aeronautics (NACA) was Founded by the United States government in 1915 in response to Europe's rapid technological advancements in aviation. Between 1915 and 1958 NACA established four research and development centers in Virginia, Ohio, and California. At these facilities the agency conducted aeronautical research, experiments, flight tests, and simulations that helped the Allied forces achieve victory in both World Wars and propelled America's growth in the aeronautics industry. In 1958 NACA evolved to include space exploration and its laboratories formed the nucleus of a new government space agency, the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA), which emphasizes peaceful applications of space technology.

Dr. John F. Victory was NACAs very first employee in 1915 and he served the institution through the entirety of its existence, retiring several years after the agency was absorbed by NASA. As Executive Secretary, Victory recorded the United States government's involvement with aviation research and development. He played a crucial role in establishing NACA's first research facility at Langley Field, Virginia. He also testified before Congress and drafted national and international regulations concerning aviation. Victory's contributions received official recognition including the Presidential Medal of Freedom, the Air Foundation Certificate of Recognition, and the Wright Brothers Memorial Trophy.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The John F. Victory Collection (MS 20) was donated to the Air Force Academy by John's wife, Marie, in 1977. The collection includes 64 archival boxes containing photographs, manuscripts, correspondence, and official reports documenting the entire history of NACA and Victory's involvement in the agency. This collection maintains the original order in which it was received and has been divided into twelve series, outlined below.

SERIES ONE: CORRESPONDENCE

Consists of correspondence and memoranda related to Victory's official and personal activities, 1914-1974. Early correspondence pertains to Victory's involvement with the growth and operation of NACA and his activities in support of the promotion of civil aviation in the United States. Included in these files are memoranda and correspondence regarding the 25th and 50th

anniversaries of flight, NACA's lobbying efforts on behalf of the creation of a department of civil aviation, and the Air Commerce Act of 1926. Subsequent data reflects Victory's involvement with non-governmental aeronautical associations including the establishment and subsequent activities of the National Aeronautic Association (NAA), the Institute of Aeronautical Sciences, and the Air Mail Pioneers. While generally reflecting Victory's official duties. The data reflects Victory's personal contacts with aviation pioneers, celebrations of aeronautical events, and his varied civic interests such as the Washington Board of Trade, Community Chest, and the Aero Club of Washington.

SERIES TWO: SPEECHES AND ADDRESSES

Consists of a series of speeches and addresses delivered by Victory and his civilian and military contemporaries, 1924-1964. Most of the speeches concern the scientific achievements of NACA and Victory's promotion of civil organizations and aeronautical events.

SERIES THREE: NATIONAL AERONAUTIC ASSOCIATION (NAA)

Consists of correspondence, memoranda, printed matter, and photographs pertaining to the establishment, operation, and activities of the NAA. The bulk of the material pertains to the NAA's participation in the authentication of aeronautical records, certification and celebration of aeronautical events, presentations of the Collier, Wright Brothers, and Elder Statesman of Aviation trophies, and the coordination of aeronautical modeling, gliding, parachuting, and ballooning competitions.

SERIES FOUR: BIOGRAPHY

Consists of numerous biographical sketches of Victory at various stages of his career with NACA.

SERIES FIVE: PHOTOGRAPHS

Consists of a series of photographs (the majority of which are captioned) that depict members of NACA. Topics include inspections by military and congressional leaders of the Langley Laboratory, participants at aeronautical celebrations including the 25th and 50th anniversaries of powered flight, Victory's thirtieth and thirty-fifth anniversaries with NACA, and various social functions.

SERIES SIX: TOPICAL FILES

Consists of a series of correspondence, memoranda, printed matter, and photographs gathered and arranged subjectively by Victory. The series covers a myriad of topics related to Victory's official duties and personal and civic interests.

SERIES SEVEN: HISTORICAL FILES

Consists of limited correspondence, printed matter, and photographs gathered by Victory in support of major aeronautical events. Included are fragmented files concerning the court-martial of Gen. Billy Mitchell and the Honorary Breakfast given for Charles Lindbergh on 13 June 1927.

SERIES EIGHT: SCRAPBOOKS

Consists of a series of bound volumes, compiled by Victory, containing correspondence and printed matter related to Victory's promotional activities on behalf of civil aviation and NACA,

1941-1952. The bulk of the material reflects Victory's social activities, speaking engagements, and involvement with celebrations of aeronautical events. Some water and rust damage are present in some items within the scrapbook folders.

SERIES NINE: LEGISLATION

Consists of numerous legislative bills and congressional hearings pertaining to the development of the space program, which were gathered by Victory between 1959 and 1960, prior to his retirement from federal service.

SERIES TEN: MANUSCRIPTS

Consists of a series of writings by Victory including his graduate thesis *The Relationship of Law to Aviation* and his partially completed manuscript *The History of NACA*.

SERIES ELEVEN: PRINTED MATTER

Consists of a fragmented file of periodical literature collected by Victory during his career with NACA. The bulk of the data pertains to the evolution of civil and military aviation in the United States.

SERIES TWELVE: MISCELLANEOUS

Consists of a fragmented file of shorthand notes, invitations, note cards, forms, etc.
