**BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE:
 WOMEN AIRFORCE SERVICE PILOTS (WASP)**

With the bombing of Pearl Harbor and the United States' sudden entry into World War II, the military found itself without enough qualified pilots. To release male pilots for combat flying, the Army Air Force, in August 1943, authorized the establishment of the Women Airforce Service Pilots, or WASP. Although the organization operated under the Civil Service, the WASPs were subjected to most of the military procedures required of men, with the notable exclusion of combat flying.

The WASPs' contribution to the military effort in World War II was significant. Besides ferrying aircraft for the Air Transport Command, they flew test flights, performed tow target missions, provided instrument training for male trainees, and participated in a variety of other flying missions. Approximately a thousand WASPs flew 60 million miles on operational assignments in 77 types of aircraft before the program was inactivated in December 1944. They delivered pursuit planes, such as the P-38, P-40, P-51 and P-47. They towed targets in B-26s and flew gunners in B-17s. One woman flew a B-29 as the aircraft's first female pilot, and another was the first woman to fly a jet fighter plane as a test pilot. Thirty-six women pilots were injured, and 38 lost their lives during their service.

Following the war, it took 33 years of lobbying before congress issued honorable discharges and veterans' benefits to WASP members. This legislation, passed in 1979, also authorized them to wear the World War II Victory medals and the Honorable Service pins that they had earned during their service.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE: YVONNE C. "PAT" PATEMAN

Lieutenant Colonel Yvonne "Pat" Pateman began her long and successful military career in 1943 when she entered the Army Air Forces and earned her wings as a Woman Airforce Service Pilot (WASP). She was the only WASP to have served in three wars: World War II, Korea, and Vietnam. She retired in 1971 after over twenty years as a U.S. Air Force Intelligence Officer. She devoted her later years to bringing recognition to WASP veterans and championing women military aviators through her public speaking and publications. In 1976, Pateman helped WASP women become eligible for Veterans' Administration benefits. She was director of the board for an advocacy organization called Women in the Military Service for America (WIMSA), which

successfully raised money and built a memorial to all military women at the entrance to Arlington National Cemetery in Virginia. She served ten years as the WASP Chair for Military and Veterans Affairs and was National President for the WASP WWII Museum from 1990 to 1992. Pateman authored the non-fiction book *Women Who Dared*, which was the first to acknowledge women who were military test pilots from WWII to 1996. Following a long struggle with Parkinson's disease, Pat Pateman died in 2004 at the age of 84.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

Lt Col Pateman's collection is one of the most comprehensive collections regarding the history of the WASP. It consists of correspondence, reports, personal narratives, oral histories, photographs and printed matter related to the history of the WASP during World War II, as well as their post-war struggle for acknowledgement and benefits.

The collection was donated to Clark Special Collections in 1988. The materials came to USAFA having already been organized by Lt Col Pateman into twenty-six "volumes." The original volumes have been divided into twenty-six boxes, plus an additional three addendums divided among two boxes. Descriptions for the addendums can be found in the pages following those of the primary collection, at the end of this document. Efforts to maintain Pateman's original organizational structure were made during processing. However, some additional materials that were not accounted for in the original index have been added to the finding aid. Likewise, materials from the index that were not located have been removed. A brief overview of the contents of each volume is provided below.

VOLUME 1: OFFICIAL DOCUMENTATION

Five folders consisting of special orders, personnel actions, uniform directives, diplomas, and rosters of WASP members.

VOLUME 2: AVIATION

Four folders consisting of flight records, a/c check lists, ground school, and flying safety documentation.

VOLUME 3: WWII WASP PHOTOS

Four folders consisting of photographs from WASP assignments during World War II. Descriptions were provided by Pateman and other WASP members.

VOLUME 4: WWII WASP SLIDES

Two folders consisting of almost 150 slides. Most images depict WASP members in training or on assignment during World War II. Also included are articles and artwork from various publications. Descriptions were provided by Pateman and other WASP members.

VOLUME 5: WWII NEWS ITEMS

One folder consisting of news clips and magazine articles written about WASP between 1942 and 1944.

VOLUME 6: WASP HISTORIES

Fifteen folders consisting of articles and stories about WASP written after the time of the events they describe. Many of them were written by WASP members.

VOLUME 7: WWII PERIODICALS

Consists of publications and individual articles written about WASP and women aviators in general, produced between 1941 and 1944. Individual articles are in a folder and full-length publications are stored loosely.

VOLUME 8: POST-WAR WASP ARTICLES

Consists of publications and individual articles written about WASPs and women aviators in general, produced between 1948 and 1988. Individual articles are in a folder and full-length publications are stored loosely.

VOLUME 9: CONGRESSIONAL RECORDS

Five folders comprised of congressional records such as resolutions, hearings, and laws. Topics include the appointment of female pilots and aviation trainees in the Army Air Forces in 1944, and changes in the civil service status of WASP members in the 1980s.

VOLUME 10: CORRESPONDENCE

Two folders comprised of both official and unofficial correspondence. Official correspondence includes letters, announcements, memorandums, and more from prominent individuals such as Jacqueline Cochran and Henry “Hap” Arnold. Unofficial correspondence includes letters written from one WASP member to another, and between them and their families.

VOLUME 11: “33 YEARS TO RIGHT A WRONG”

Two folders comprised of materials describing the contributions and sacrifices of WASP members, and their struggle to recognition as veterans. Includes legal documentation, news clips, and articles produced primarily in the late 1970s.

VOLUME 12: WASP FATALITIES

Six folders comprised of accident reports, lists, and articles covering WASP fatalities, as well as obituaries that appeared in local newspapers. This volume includes records for over thirty individual WASP members.

VOLUME 13: WASP REUNIONS

Four folders comprised of records, announcements, advertisements, and photographs covering WASP reunions held between 1946 and 2008.

VOLUME 14: WASP IN MILITARY SERVICE

Seven folders comprised of military records from various WASP members, arranged in alphabetical order. Some include correspondence from WASPs to Pateman upon sending the records to her.

VOLUME 15: WASP IN THE NEWS

Six folders comprised of news articles, magazine articles, and press releases written about the WASP and its members between 1945 and 1988. Photographs and artwork are also included.

VOLUME 16: MEMORABILIA

One folder comprised of greeting cards, poems, photographs, patches, and more regarding WASPs and their activities.

VOLUME 17: RESEARCH ITEMS

Nine folders consisting of papers, reports, interviews, and biographies of WASP members. This volume also includes dozens of survey questionnaires returned by WASP members who could be located in 1967 requesting information about their wartime service (planes flown, bases etc.), as well as information about their lives since leaving the service.

VOLUME 18: WASP NEWSLETTERS

Twenty-two folders comprised of WASP newsletters including *The Avenger*, *The WASP Newsletter*, and *WASP News*. These newsletters are in chronological order, some of which are originals and some that are copies.

VOLUME 19: MISCELLANEOUS WASP PAPERS

Three folders comprised of various miscellaneous documents including items from the Order of Fifinella (OOF), mini-reunions, and regional newsletters. These regional newsletters describe life on the home front, and the various activities of local men and women who were serving overseas during World War II.

VOLUME 20: AUDIO TAPES

One box of audio tapes and corresponding digital files on CD regarding various post-war WASP activities between 1975 and 1986.

VOLUME 21 POST WAR ROSTERS AND SONG BOOKS

Two folders consisting of WASP rosters and songbooks. One of the rosters was produced in 1942, and the others in the 1980s. There is no production information for the songbooks.

VOLUME 22: MICROFILM

Eleven rolls of microfilm covering various aspects of the WASP program including training, public relations, statistical reports, and more dated between 1942 and 1945.

VOLUME 23: VIDEO TAPES

One box of VHS tapes and corresponding digital files on DVD consisting of documentaries and WASP reunions filmed between 1941 and 1988.

VOLUME 24: PATEMAN BOOK COLLECTION

Ten boxes of books from Pateman's personal collection, most of which relate to the history of women aviators. Books were published between 1935 and 2001. As a condition of Pateman's donation, the books remain together in the manuscript collection, though several volumes have been catalogued and are shelved separately in Special Collection's non-circulating stacks. The books located outside of the Pateman/WASP collection are noted in the finding aid.

VOLUME 25: YVONNE C. PATEMAN

Fifteen folders consisting of items relating specifically to Yvonne C. Pateman herself. Included are official documents regarding Pateman's military career, items from the donation of this collection to the United States Air Force Academy Library in 1989, interviews, and materials from her college education at the University of Maryland.

VOLUME 26: ORIGINAL INDEX

One binder containing the original index that was included with the collection when it was donated in 1989, presumably created by Pateman. The binder also includes some photographs and background information.

ADDENDUM 1

One folder containing art prints, a roster, and a book of Class 44-W-9 WASP.

ADDENDUM 2

Two binders and one package containing newspaper clippings about women at the US Air Force Academy and several small artifacts.

ADDENDUM 3

Two folders and one package containing records for Pateman such as awards, performance reports, and flight logs.
