## **Scope and Content Note**

This record group addendum consists of five boxes of materials arranged into nine series, which pertain to the Carpetbaggers and their work in aiding the resistance in Denmark, Norway, and Sweden during World War II. These materials were collected by Lt. Col. Bradbury.

**SERIES ONE: OFFICIAL HISTORIES**, consists of histories by the Army Air Force Historical Office and a history of the 492<sup>nd</sup> Group, describing their missions to aid the resistance and insert agents into occupied Norway and Denmark during World War II.

**SERIES TWO:** MISSION REPORTS, consists of reports on Carpetbagger missions, including weather, drop zones, radio frequencies, cargoes dropped, flight paths and the success or failure of each mission.

**SERIES THREE:** MISSION NARRATIVES, consists of official and unofficial accounts of many of the missions flown or assisted by the Carpetbaggers. They contain eyewitness accounts of missions flown and resistance activity on the ground, that was observed by crew members shot down and who evaded with the help of the resistance during the occupation of Europe.

<u>SERIES FOUR</u>: COMMUNICATIONS BY FILM, RADIO TRANSMISSIONS, AND TELEGRAMS, consists of communications and instructions sent between London and various resistance groups or individuals. Most are translated into English, but some of the messages are in the native language but English copies are attached.

**SERIES FIVE: LISTS OF AGENTS**, consists of several lists of resistance agents in Denmark including their code and real names as well. Also within the series is a list of "Nominal Agents," and their activities from recruitment to the end of the war.

**SERIES SIX: MEMORANDA**, consists of memos pertaining to escape and evasion, and reports of visits to Europe during the war. Included are inventories of equipment and supplies sent to Norway and Denmark during the war.

**SERIES SEVEN: PHOTOGRAPHS**, consists of photographs and photocopies of the Carpetbaggers used by Ben Parnell in his books about the group and their activities. Additional

photographs may be found in the series of correspondence, sent to Parnell by various individuals who were members of air crews or the resistance in Norway or Denmark.

#### **BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH**

From the obituary of J.W. Bradbury by "The Friends and Colleagues of Lt. Colonel J.W. Bradbury."

"Lt. Colonel Bradbury was a World War II veteran and an original faculty member of the Academy's Department of Political Science. He became interested in the history of American air crew members who either were shot down or crashed over occupied territories during the war. Many of these airmen were members of the 492<sup>nd</sup> Bombardment Group, known as the "Carpetbaggers." Several of the surviving crews were rescued by resistance fighters who assisted in their escapes. Lt. Colonel Bradbury began a long association with the resistance fighters and Carpetbaggers to include attending their 50<sup>th</sup> reunion in 1992. Through this association, he was able to provide books, diaries, papers, and other memorabilia to the Air Force Academy Library. These historical materials are invaluable sources of information addressing the critical cooperation between the resistance and the Army Air Forces during World War II."

Lt. Col. Bradbury (always J.W., or "Brad," never Julian), February 8, 1919-February 6, 2015, was a World War II veteran and staff member of the Academy. This addition to the Carpetbaggers collection comes from the materials Brad collected through his position of staff researcher on World War II special operations. This position was natural for him, as he served in the 856/857th Bombardment Group as a copilot of the Sheppard Crew, who flew the "Heaven's Devil" B-24 Liberator. After World War II, Brad served in a number of positions, including but not limited to: Assistant Legal & Claims Officer at Kelly Field, Texas; Base Legal Officer at Rhein-Main Air Base, Germany; Headquarters Command, U.S. Forces European Theater (USFET), Frankfurt Military Community; Assistant Professor, Air Force ROTC at Lehigh University at Bethlehem, Pennsylvania; Associate Professor in the Political Science Department of USAFA; Evening Class professor at CU Colorado Springs; Information Officer, 17th Air Force at Ramstein, Germany; Chief, Foreign and Collateral Activities and Foreign Disclosure Policy Officer, United States Air Force in Europe (USAFE) at Wiesbaden, Germany; and Colorado Representative at the Educational Service Bureau, Washington, D.C. Through these

many positions in and around the Air Force, Brad made a number of connections, which helped him collect these materials from a wide range of sources. Brad's extensive research of this subject is in large part why this collection exists.

#### SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

This manuscript collection consists of seventy-three boxes of materials arranged into eight series, which pertain to the Carpetbaggers and their operations under the Office of Strategic Services (OSS) during World War II (WWII). These materials were collected by Lt. Col. USAF (Ret.), Julian Warren (J.W.) "Brad" Bradbury. (See Biographical Sketch above). In addition to these WWII materials, material related to other facets of Lt. Col. Bradbury's life, such as his time on the United States Air Force Academy (USAFA) faculty, his compilation of modern Special Operations (SO) material, his civic duties, and his personal interests and hobbies are found in Series One and Series Eight.

The arrangement is as follows:

**SERIES ONE: EARLY YEARS**, consists of personal information about Lt. Col. Bradbury, his life, his career, and his family.
