BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

John Francis “Joe” Guilmartin, Jr. was born September 18, 1940 in Alabama and grew up in San Antonio, Texas. He graduated from the U.S. Air Force Academy in 1962 with a Bachelor of Science in History. Following graduation, he attended Air Force undergraduate pilot training (1963) and helicopter school (1964), after which he was assigned as a rescue pilot in the Air Rescue Service. From 1965-1966, he served his first tour in Southeast Asia, flying HH-3E “Jolly Green Giant” helicopters on rescue missions from Thailand to recover American aviators downed in hostile territory.

Following his combat tour, he attended Princeton University on an Air Force-sponsored program, earning a Master of Art (1969) and Doctor of Philosophy in History (1971). His doctoral dissertation, *Changing Technology and Mediterranean Warfare at Sea in the Sixteenth Century* (1971), was the first of many works Dr. Guilmartin authored about naval history, cannon founding, and the historical application of sea power. His next assignment took him back to the U.S. Air Force Academy (USAFA), as a faculty member in the department of history. During his time at USAFA, he finished his first book, *Gunpowder and Galleys: Changing Technology and Mediterranean Warfare at Sea in the Sixteenth Century*. Cambridge University Press published the first printing in 1974, followed by a second printing in 1980.

In 1973, he returned to flying and staff assignments in Aerospace Rescue and Recovery Service, including another tour in Southeast Asia (1975), flying HH-53C Super Jolly Green Giant helicopters, and serving as a senior staff officer in the helicopter units involved in the evacuations of Phnom Penh and Saigon. During the evacuation of Saigon, he flew twelve sorties from the carrier *USS Midway*, lifting over 500 evacuees to safety.

He returned to academia in 1978, with an assignment to the Air War College in Montgomery, Alabama, as the editor of *Air University Review*, the professional journal of the United States Air Force, a position he held until his retirement from the Air Force in 1983. He retired as a Lieutenant Colonel with a command pilot rating. His decorations include two Silver Stars for

valor in action over Southeast Asia, the Air Medal with five oak leaf clusters and the Legion of Merit.

After retirement from the Air Force, Dr. Guilmartin became the director of the Space Shuttle History Project and an adjunct professor of history at Rice University in Houston, Texas (1983-1986). The Space Shuttle History Project published a five volume historical chronology of the space shuttle program (1988).

Following a position as the senior Secretary of the Navy research fellow at the United States Naval War College in Newport, Rhode Island (1986-1987), Dr. Guilmartin joined the faculty of The Ohio State University in the history department. Among his publications from this time are *Helicopters* in Bantam's *Illustrated History of the Vietnam War* (1988), *America in Vietnam: The Fifteen Year War* (1991), *A Very Short War: The Mayaguez and the Battle of Koh Tang* (1995) and *Galleons and Galleys* (2002). Dr. Guilmartin was the primary author and editor-in-chief of Vol. IV, *Weapons, Tactics and Training*, *Gulf War Air Power Survey Report* (1993), having received an executive appointment as a task force leader on the Gulf War Air Power Survey, established by the Secretary of the Air Force, Donald B. Rice, to assess the role and effect of air power in the Persian Gulf War.

In addition to his work at Ohio State University, Dr. Guilmartin held the Charles Lindbergh Chair at the Air and Space Museum in Washington, D.C. and served as a visiting professor at the U.S. Military Academy at West Point. He also served on the board of trustees for the Society for Military History, regularly participated in conferences of the International Commission on Military History, and served as the historian for the Jolly Green Pilots Association.

Dr. Guilmartin continued as a professor of history at Ohio State University until his death in 2016.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

This collection contains material concerning Dr. Guilmartin's military career, his professional career as a professor of history at Ohio State University and his work in military historical research. This collection consists of personal and professional papers, correspondence and photographic materials, manuscripts and drafts of publications, research material including notes, notebooks, and notecards. The collection consists of sixty-four boxes arranged in fifteen series and material in the map case located in SPC storage room Map Case 1 Map Drawer 4. The arrangement by topic reflects Dr. Guilmartin's professional activities and interests.

SERIES ONE: PERSONAL PAPERS, consists of biographical information, diaries and personal papers and is divided into two subseries. **Boxes 1-4, 32 folders.**

SUBSERIES A: UNITED STATES AIR FORCE, consists of personal and professional papers related to his time in the U.S. Air Force.

SUBSERIES B: OHIO STATE UNIVERSITY, consists mainly of course information with some personal and professional papers.

SERIES TWO: CORRESPONDENCE, consists of personal and professional correspondence, arranged by correspondent and date. **Boxes 5-6, 36 folders.**

SERIES THREE: MANUSCRIPTS, consists of manuscripts, drafts, contracts, and other records for published and unpublished works and is arranged by title and date. **Boxes 7-12, 77 folders.**

SERIES FOUR: PAPERS, consists of lectures and conference papers and is arranged by date. **Boxes 13-15, 41 folders.**

SERIES FIVE: REVIEWS, contains published book reviews and review articles, arranged by date. **Box 15, 6 folders.**

SERIES SIX: CONFERENCES, contains materials from conferences, including notes taken by Dr. Guilmartin and some ephemera. It is arranged by date of the conference. **Boxes 15-17, 43 folders.**

SERIES SEVEN: PROFESSIONAL SERVICES, contains materials related to work undertaken by Dr. Guilmartin in addition to his primary occupation and is arranged alphabetically. **Boxes 17-18, 24 folders.**

SERIES EIGHT: RESEARCH, is the largest series and contains material collected by Dr. Guilmartin related to his research, writing, and teaching. It is arranged alphabetically and chronologically and sorted into the following topics:

SUBSERIES B: CANNON AND OTHER WEAPONS, Box 20, 9 folders.
