## **BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE**

George F. Hennrikus was an officer in the US Air Force and the Information Services Officer for the Air Force Academy Construction Agency (AFACA), a government agency formed in 1954 to supervise the design and construction of the Air Force Academy. In this position, Hennrikus facilitated communication between the AFACA and Air Force officials, members of the media, and local civic leaders. He also delivered presentations regarding the construction of the Academy, gave tours of the facilities, and performed other public affairs duties as needed. Details regarding the AFACA can be found within the collection in a letter from Col. Albert E. Stoltz to Col. Edgar A. Holt in Box 1, Folder 2.

### SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

As Information Services Officer for the Air Force Academy Construction Agency, Hennrikus was responsible for distributing information and photographs to the Air Force, the media, and other interested parties. The items in this collection were assembled as a result of these activities, which his wife donated to the Academy following Hennrikus's death in 1992. This collection consists of six boxes divided into seven series, outlined below.

## SERIES ONE: USAFA CONSTRUCTION AGENCY OFFICIAL RECORDS

Consists of Hennrikus's personal records including TDY orders, correspondence pertaining to the construction and planning for the Air Force Academy, and construction information for the various contracts involved in the construction of the Air Force Academy.

## **SERIES TWO: PUBLIC AFFAIRS**

Consists of news releases, public announcements, and promotional materials, including press packets regarding the construction and opening of the Air Force Academy.

## **SERIES THREE: MAPS AND CHARTS**

Consists of maps of the Air Force Academy grounds and Colorado Springs, along with two aeronautical charts covering different parts of Colorado.

## **SERIES FOUR: GRADUATION, 1959**

Consists of memorabilia pertaining to the first graduation held at the Air Force Academy.

## **SERIES FIVE: PUBLISHED MATERIALS**

Consists of various articles from local and national newspapers that provide a comprehensive overview of the details, controversies, and challenges associated with the construction of the

academy. Specific topics include congressional funding, water rights, land acquisition, housing projects, design controversy, and more.

## **SERIES SIX: PHOTOGRAPHS**

Consists of photographs taken primarily of the Air Force Academy and the Academy grounds shortly before, during, and shortly after construction in the late 1950s. This series includes photos of dedication ceremonies, the class of 1959 graduation, conceptual photos of the Academy before construction, and people involved in the construction process.

## SERIES SEVEN: AUDIOVISUAL

Consists of two 16mm reels of movie footage and two reel-to-reel audio tapes. The audio tapes are digitized to DVD and are included in the box.
