BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Born in Indiana, Colonel Coffee earned a Bachelor of Science in Engineering from Purdue University before working for the Chicago, Milwaukee, St. Paul, and Pacific Railroad. Called to active duty in 1941, he served in New Guinea, the Philippines, and the United Nations until he was discharged and returned to the railroad. Recalled to active duty in 1951, he served in Japan as chief of the construction division, Far East Air Forces, where he was responsible for the development of Okinawa as a B-29 base, and construction of the United Nations bases in Korea. On return to the United States, Colonel Coffee was a key member of the Air Force Academy Construction Agency, which supervised the design and construction of the Academy grounds and buildings.
