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BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Arthur P. Moore was a Colonel in the US Army and a prisoner of war in the Philippines, Taiwan, Japan, and finally China from May 1942 until the end of World War II. He was stationed at Corregidor Island in the Philippines when his commander, General John Wainwright, was ordered to surrender to the attacking Japanese in the Battle of Bataan in May 1942. Upon his release he was awarded a Silver Star for his actions in this battle. Arthur's wife, Marjorie E. Moore, appears to have joined her husband in many of the locations where he was stationed during and after his military career, and kept a record of their travels in photographs and diaries. David M. Hudak donated their collection to the United States Air Force Academy, through the USAFA Association of Graduates, in December 2007. This collection is named for Hudak in accordance with a commitment made by McDermott Library administration, which is noted in the donor paperwork.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

This collection consists of fourteen boxes of materials arranged into thirteen series, outlined below. It relates to both the military experiences of Arthur Moore and the private life of he and his wife, Marjorie Elizabeth Moore.

SERIES ONE: PRINTED MATERIALS

Consists of newsletters, books, and magazines from various Prisoner of War organizations pertaining to World War II and efforts to help prisoners during this period. Also included are programs from various social events attended by Mrs. Moore.

SERIES TWO: NEWSPAPERS AND NEWSPAPER CLIPPINGS

Consists of front pages of newspapers during World War II pertaining to the Pacific Theater of the war. Included are articles about Colonel Arthur P. Moore. Also included are clippings pertaining to the death of General John Wainwright's wife and the obituaries of other friends.

SERIES THREE: CORRESPONDENCE

Consists of letters sent to and from Marjorie Moore to her husband Arthur P. Moore while he was a prisoner of war in the Philippines, Japan, and China. Also included are letters to family members and from people who monitored Japanese radio broadcasts and heard Colonel Moore's voice on the radio letting people in the United States he was alive and well.

SERIES FOUR: ARTWORK

Consists of a booklet of sketches drawn by Mrs. Moore as a teenager and a book by a former prisoner of war consisting of caricatures of P.O.W. life as a prisoner of war of the Japanese.

SERIES FIVE: PHOTOGRAPH ALBUMS AND PHOTOGRAPHS

Consists of photograph albums and photographs of Mrs. Moore as a teenager, as well as photographs of their son that she sent to her husband while he was a prisoner of war. Also included are photographs of Mrs. Moore before the war in Hawaii and a scrapbook from a tour of post-war Europe.

SERIES SIX: TRIP DIARIES, 1949, 1957

Consists of two trip diaries from visits to Spain and Europe.

SERIES SEVEN: PASSPORTS

Consists of expired passports belonging to Arthur and Marjorie Moore.

SERIES EIGHT: MAPS

Consists of maps of areas of the Pacific Theater of the war, where Colonel Arthur P. Moore was held prisoner.

SERIES NINE: UNIFORM ITEMS

Consists of a belt, cap, and gold shoulder braid owned by Colonel Moore during his military career.

SERIES TEN: INSIGNIA AND BADGES

Consists of uniform insignia, shoulder boards, and other badges and buttons used by Colonel Moore during his military career.

SERIES ELEVEN: CERTIFICATES, 1939

Consists of a certificate commissioning Arthur P. Moore as a Major in the Field Artillery, 1939.

SERIES TWELVE: ARTIFACTS

Consists of items use by Colonel and Mrs. Moore during their military and civilian careers. Also included is the cloth identification tag worn by Colonel Moore during his time as a Japanese prisoner of war.

SERIES THIRTEEN: MISCELLANEOUS

Consists of items not suitable to be placed in other series.
