BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Lieutenant General Bradley Clark Hosmer (born October 8, 1937) served as the twelfth Superintendent of the United States Air Force Academy in Colorado Springs, Colorado from 1991 to 1994. He was the first Academy graduate to return as superintendent. Hosmer was born in San Antonio, Texas in 1937. He earned his Bachelor of Science degree in 1959 from the United States Air Force Academy, where he was the top graduate of the Academy's first graduating class. He subsequently won a Rhodes scholarship and earned his master's degree in international relations from Oxford University. Hosmer is also a graduate of the Air Force Squadron Officer School, the Naval Command and Staff College, and the National War College.

Hosmer served in a variety of staff positions, including vice director of the Joint Staff and Air Force Inspector General. He commanded the 479th Tactical Training Wing, Holloman Air Force Base, New Mexico from 1978 to 1979; the 347th Tactical Fighter Wing, Moody Air Force Base, Georgia from 1979 to 1981; and the 831st Air Division, George Air Force Base, California from 1981 to 1982. From 1986 to 1989, he served as president of the National Defense University, Fort McNair, Washington, D.C. Hosmer was a command pilot with more than 4,000 flying hours in aircraft to include the T-33 Shooting Star, T-37, AT-38, O-1, F-4, F-16 Fighting Falcon, F-15 Eagle, F-100, and General Dynamics F-111.

His decorations include the Defense Distinguished Service Medal, the Defense Superior Service Medal, Legion of Merit with oak leaf cluster, Distinguished Flying Cross, Bronze Star with oak leaf cluster, Meritorious Service Medal, Air Medal with four oak leaf clusters, and the Air Force Commendation Medal.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

This collection consists of thirteen boxes and one hundred nineteen packages of material arranged into seventeen series, outlined below. Except for the documents outlined in Series Ten, all of the materials in this portion of the collection are framed photographs or artifacts presented to general Hosmer throughout his career. Additionally, there are seven addendums to this collection each with their own arrangement and description. This collection was originally processed on an unknown date by an unknown processor, and was reviewed and updated in May 2021. Some items are listed as "unavailable," and their locations are currently unknown.

Descriptive narratives have been provided for by him for some of the more significant photographs. The series has been calendared within the Arrangement and Description section of this manuscript record.

SERIES FOUR: ARTWORK

Consists of pencil sketches, paintings, and prints given to Lt. Gen. and Mrs. Hosmer. Descriptive narratives have been provided for the more significant items in this series. The series has been calendared within the Arrangement and Description section of this manuscript record.

SERIES FIVE: STATUARY

Consists of a collection of statues that were presented to Lt. Gen. Hosmer during his military career. Descriptive narratives have been provided by him for significant items within the series. The series has been calendared within the Arrangement and Description section of this manuscript record.

SERIES SIX: AWARDS AND CITATIONS

Consists of some of the awards received by Lt. Gen. Hosmer during his cadet and military career. The series has been calendared within the Arrangement and Description section of this manuscript record.

SERIES SEVEN: SILVER, PEWTER, BRASSWARE

Consists of a collection of silver, pewter, and brassware items that were presented to Lt. Gen. Hosmer during his military career. Included are the silver bowls he received upon graduation as the Outstanding Graduate of the Class of 1959 from the United States Air Force Academy. The series has been calendared within the Arrangement and Description section of this manuscript record.

SERIES EIGHT: MEDALLIONS

Consists of various medallions that were presented to Lt. Gen. Hosmer during his military career. The series has been calendared within the Arrangement Description section of this manuscript record.

SERIES NINE: BOOKS

Consists of books used by Lt. Gen. Hosmer as a Rhodes Scholar at Oxford and during his military career. The series has been calendared within the Arrangement and Description section of this manuscript record.

SERIES TEN: PRINTED MATTER

Consists of a collection of flight manuals, crewmember manuals for some of the planes flown by Lt. Gen. Hosmer during his military career, and several guidebooks of the cities of London and Oxford. The series has been calendared within the Arrangement and Description section of this manuscript record.

SERIES ELEVEN: AIRPLANE MODELS

Consists of several models that were presented to Lt. Gen. Hosmer during his military career. The series has been calendared within the Arrangement and Description section of this manuscript record.

SERIES TWELVE: FLAGS

Consists of several flags that were presented to Lt. Gen. Hosmer during his military career. Included is a brigadier general's flag, and American flags that were flown over the battleship U.S.S. Arizona at Pearl Harbor, the Capitol Building in Washington, D.C., and the United States Air Force Academy. The series has been calendared within the Arrangement and Description section of this manuscript record.

SERIES THIRTEEN: UNIFORMS AND UNIFORM ACCESSORIES

Consists of uniforms and clothing items worn by, or presented to Lt. Gen. Hosmer during his military career. Descriptive narratives have been provided by him for many of these items. The series has been calendared within the Arrangement and Description section of this manuscript record.

SERIES FOURTEEN: DESK SETS

Consists of pen sets and nameplates used by Lt. Gen. Hosmer during his military career.

Consists of a Soviet officer's dagger and a traditional Japanese police weapon. Both items were presented as gifts to Lt. Gen. Hosmer.

Consists of two disarmed inscribed shells that were presented to Lt. Gen. Hosmer. The series has been calendared within the Arrangement and Description section of this manuscript record.

Achromayev was stunned by what he saw in the competence of our enlisted troops. Crowe believed this was a key step in end of the cold war. Adm. Crowe gave me this. Was at NDU by then."

This was a unique wing in AF, started up in Jan 1977, and all the logistics and manpower were wrong at the beginning. Very challenging times." Presented to Col. Hosmer, 479 TTW, Commander, 2 May 1978-28 August 1979.

Package 56 Framed painting of T-38. "Brad Hosmer, Commander - Leader - Friend, from 465 TTS, August 79, Good Luck, Check Six." Artist, George Bracken, a WSO in 465th Squadron.

The tailor, Alex & Long, was a military specialty shop and could make a correct uniform for virtually any country. Superb workmanship."

Package 93 Dress blues. "Mandated by Gen. Gabriel in 1984, along with the dress whites. The next chief, Gen. Welch, dropped the whites but kept the blues. so they were used until 1992. Used rarely, mostly in Washington. I had them these in Korea (1984?). I did not specify U.S. material, so they have tell-tale grey tint."

Package 94 Flight jacket with lieutenant general stars, patches for 94th ATS, and 58th Tactical Training Wing on sleeves. Patch for 557th FTS in pocket.

Package 95 Flight jacket with colonel eagles. "Winter flying jacket, heavy stuff. Issued for operation Jack Frost, in winter 1975-1976 (?), in Alaska. Flew F-111's from 474th TFW at Nellis; I was ADO then. Actually wore heavier gear over this in Alaska, including "Bunny Boots. My size 12s barely fit in cockpit. Orange scarf in left inside pocket."

Package 96 Dress blues. "This is a 1973 prototype from the original bolt of double-knit tested by the AF Clothing Lab did the test uniforms; Globe Tailors were the contractor. I used this workhorse, and one other similar test double knit, as my only Class A uniforms from 1973 till 1983-1984 when I had two made in Korea."

Package 99 Flight suit, cloth jacket. "Two garments made by the clothing lab at Wright-Pat, late 1973. Then Maj. Glenn Jones, aide to Gen. George Brown, Chief of Staff, talked them into doing a set for himself and me as the team who travelled with Brown. This is the general officer's flight suit. The other is the G.O. flight jacket. I was embarrassed to use them but eventually had a chance after I became a B.G."

Cloth jacket, no insignia, "This is the other of the two (unauthorized) garments that Glenn Jones talked the clothing lab into making. (Unauthorized because they are ok only for gen. officers.)"

Package 102 Early desert camo BDUs, "Very early desert cammies, from 1979-1980 when only Special Forces had them. A good friend in Spec. Ops. sent me some when we were preparing at Moody, Jan/Feb 1980 to go to Egypt on Operation Proud Phantom. Used off and on as late as 1985, as Vice-Director of Joint Staff, in some field ops then. By 1986, the style had changed, and these were becoming common."

Package 103 White dress uniform, "Dress whites. Mandatory in the 1984-1988 era, optional before then. These are from 1983, early in my PACAF/XP tour. Unlike most, I got good use from whites because of Pacific duty, but very little after that.

Package 104 SERE uniform from "Country X." "Uniform built by CWI in summer of 1991, so I could visit the POW Compound as a "Country X" general, without disrupting training. Also used summer 1992. Very effective; I drew little attention from the cadets in training."

Package 105 Test dress blue uniform, "Test version of the new uniform. I was one of the wearers of the "prototype." Note sleeve stripes: the upper ones are narrower than on the final design. We started wearing them early 1992, decision in late 1992. Available in late 1994. I used it less than most test wearers during the test, as I did not feel it ok to wear in any activity that could be considered a formation, when others in formation wore the "classic" service dress.

Package 106 BDUs with brigadier general/major general/lieutenant general stars. "Basic maintenance fatigues. These were all started at Holloman and Moody, 1977-1981, and saw lots of miles and sunshine. Spent more time in them than in flight suit from 1977-1982. Great field fabric, extremely durable. These clearly all show the "3 Patch" signs of Gen. Creech's TAC: TAC, Wing, and Squadron. Also shows how some units dealt with the "HHQ" version, in this case of Air Division at George R.D.J.T.F. (later CENTCOM) patch, because we had an exercise with them when I last wore these. The other two sets were modified in rank for later use."

Package 107 Camouflaged BDUs with lieutenant general stars on collar.
